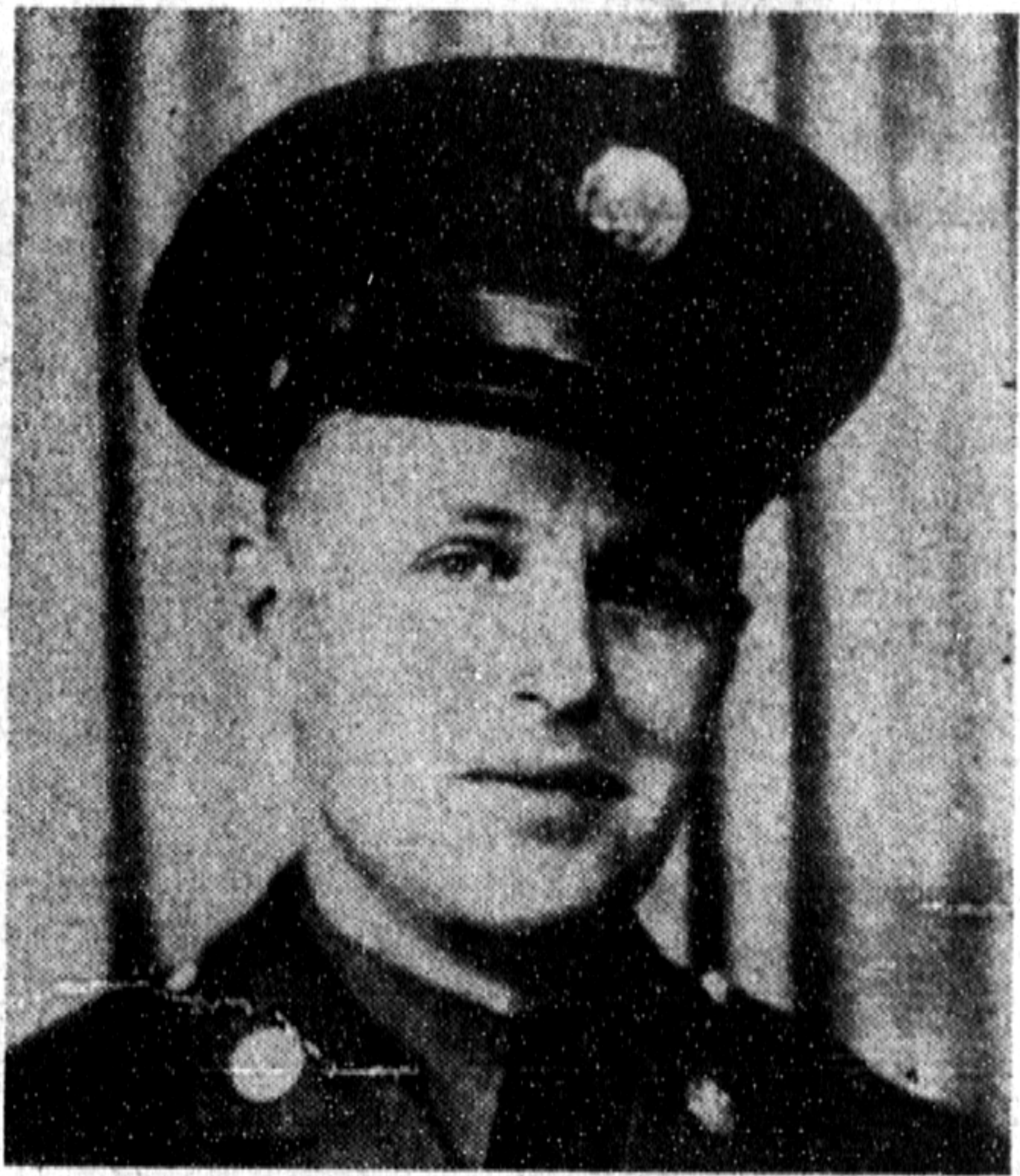

Mr. and Mrs. Glenn Allen are in receipt of two letters, one from Hearne, Texas, the other from Colorado, the two letters reading nearly the same, saying that the writers heard on short wave radio report stating that Capt. Hollis Allen of the Lost Battalion was a prisoner of war of Japan, that he was getting plenty to eat and was well taken care of. Medical attention was available, but that he had not been sick a day. He wished his folks a merry Christmas and not to worry. He also said one letter was to notify Mr. and Mrs. J. D. Brandenburg (sure it must have meant J. B.) that their son was also a prisoner.

A host of friends rejoice with the family in receiving such a Christmas present of good news.

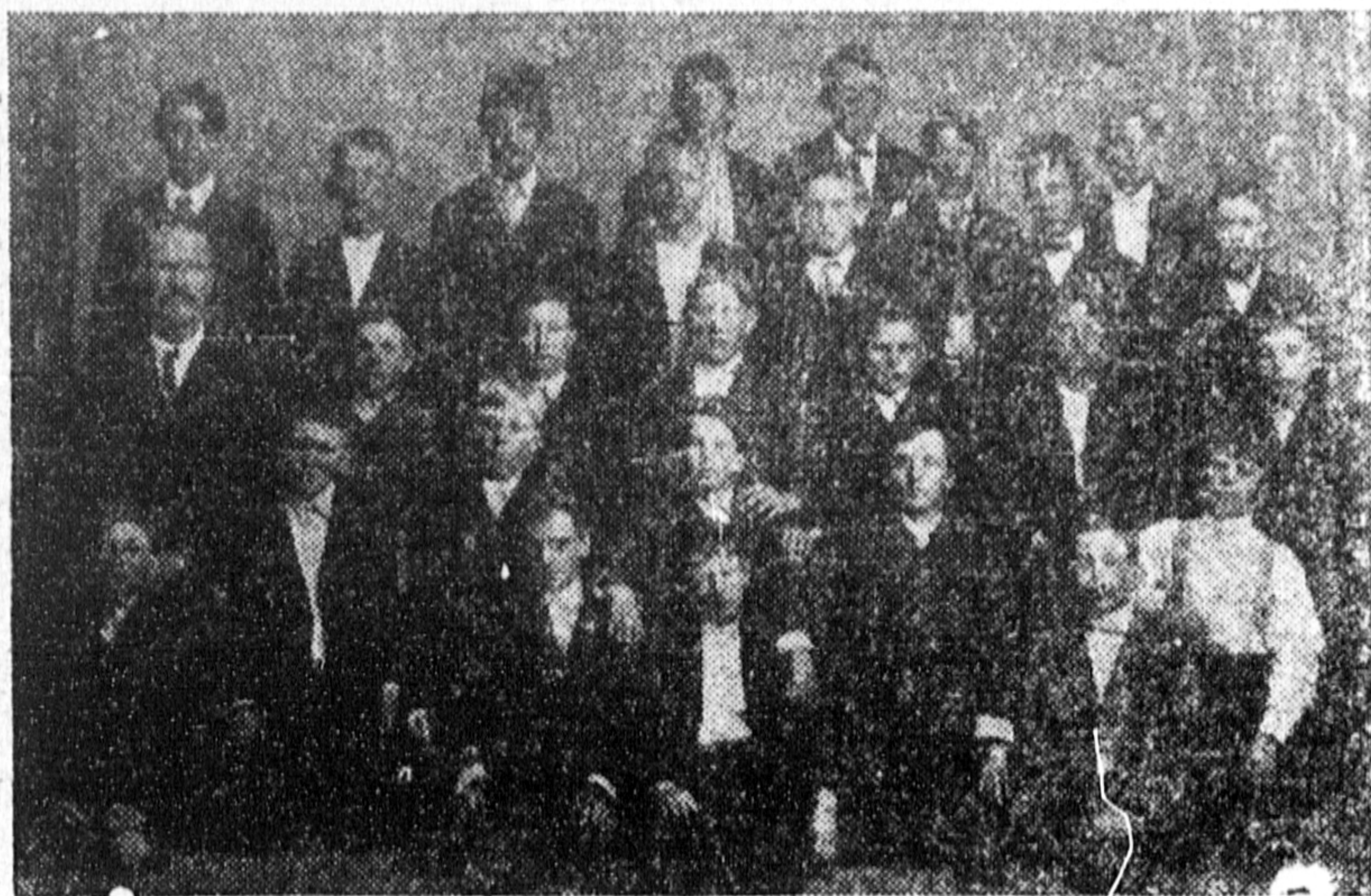

It is reported that Henry H. King, son of Mrs. E. C. King of Bryson, has been unaccounted for in the Phillipines. He was stationed at Clark Field, near Manila before the war with Japan began. His mother has received no word from him since December 2, five days before the attack on Pearl Harbor.

Battery "F" Reported Missing by War Dept.

The following is a form letter received from the War Department concerning the Jack County boys in the 2nd Battalion 131st F. A. 36th Division Texas National Guard. The kinsmen of these boys are receiving form letters of the following kind, this one being brought to the Gazette:

Mr. James M. Hicks, Rt. No. 1, Vineyard, Texas.

Dear Mr. Hicks:

According to War Department records, you have been designated as the emergency addressee of J. M. Hicks, Jr., 20,814,147, who, according to the latest information available, was serving in Java at the time of the final capitulation.

I deeply regret that it is impossible for me to give you more information than is contained in this letter. In the last days before the capitulation of Java there were casualties which were not reported to the War Department. The Japanese Government has indicated its intention of conforming to the terms of the Geneva Convention with respect to the interchange of information regarding prisoners of war. At some future date this Government will receive through Geneva a list of persons who have been taken prisoners of war. Until that time the War Department can not give you positive information.

The War Department will consider the persons serving in Java as "missing in action" until definite information to the contrary is received. It is to be hoped that the Japanese Government will communicate a list of prisoners of war at an early date. At that time you will be notified by this office in the event his name is contained in the list of prisoners of war. In the case of persons known to have been present in Java and who are not reported to be prisoners of war by the Japanese Government, the War Department will continue to carry them as "missing in action," in the absence of information to the contrary, until twelve months have expired. At the expiration of twelve months and in the absence of other information the War Department is authorized to make a final determination.

I am enclosing a memorandum regarding benefits to certain dependents of missing, captured or interned personnel.

E. C. Morris of 4 Marine Corp Reported Missing

F. L. Morris received a telegram Tuesday that his son, E. C., of the 4th Marine Corps was performing his duty in the service of his country in the Manila Bay area when that station capitulated, and that he will be carried on the records as missing pending further information.

“No information of his death. He may be a prisoner of war. It may be several months before definite official information can be expected. Any information will be communicated to you promptly.”

Mr. Morris believes E. C. was at Corregidor when it surrendered May 6. It seems the government did fast work in notifying the family here.

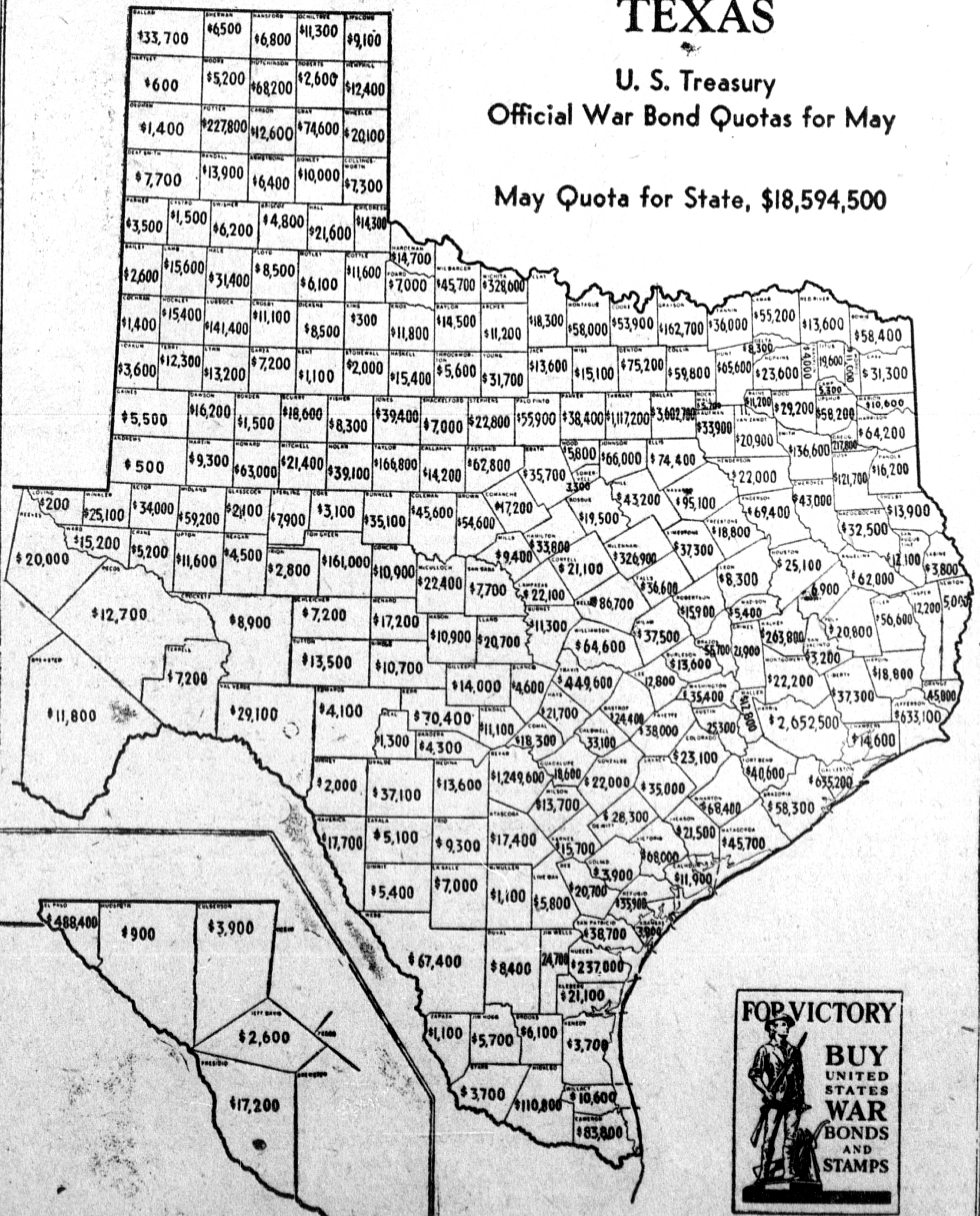
