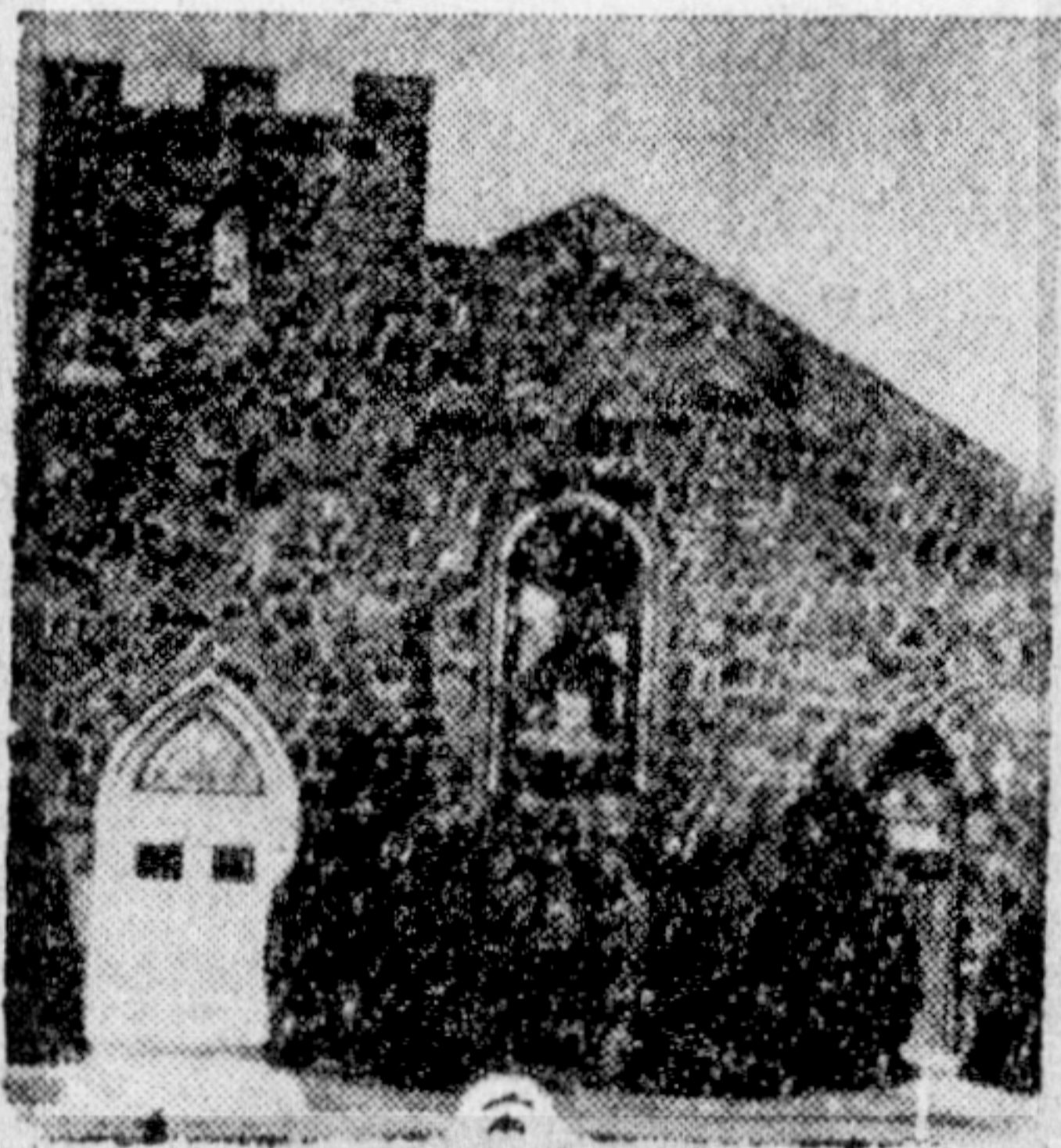

The State of Texas vs. William F. Moody, charged with the murder of Willard Peterson, started Monday morning, with the Honorable District Judge J. E. Carter on the bench; County Attorney Julette Bonner, prosecuting, assisted by Tom Miller of Graham, special prosecutor; John D. McComb, defending.

The jury was completed Monday afternoon around 4 o'clock, and testimony was started soon afterward.
